

Another plea challenging Places of Worship Act 1991 filed in Supreme Court

MI News Service, New Delhi: Another plea challenging the Constitutional validity of certain sections of the Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act 1991 was filed in the Supreme Court on Saturday stating that the said Act violates the principles of secularism.

The plea, filed by a religious guru based in Mathura, Devkundan Thakur, has challenged the constitutional validity of Sections 2, 3, and 4 of the Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act 1991, stating that it offends Articles 14, 15, 21, 25, 26, 29 of the Indian constitution and violates the principles of secularism and the rule of law, which is an integral part of the Preamble and basic structure of the Constitution. "Hindus are fighting for the restoration of the birthplace of Lord Krishna for hundreds of years with peaceful public agitation, but by enacting the Act, the Centre has excluded the birthplace of Lord Ram at Ayodhya but not the birthplace of Lord Krishna in Mathura, though both are the incarnations of Lord Vishnu: the creator," the petitioner said.

Advocate Ashwini Upadhyay, Rudra Vikram, residents of Varanasi, and Swami Jeevendranand Saraswati, a prominent religious leader, among others have



already filed a plea in the apex court against the Act. The pleas read that Sections 2, 3, and 4 of the Act have taken away the right to approach the Court and thus the Right to Judicial Remedy has been closed. Section 3 of the Act bars the conversion of places of worship, by stating "No person shall convert any place of wor-

Hijab-clad college students in K'taka sent back

The incident took place in Mangaluru's University College. The college had banned the wearing of hijab as per the decision of its syndicate. Though majority of the Muslim students attended classes on Saturday without hijab, 12 students came in wearing them. They insisted on attending classes with hijab.

However, the college principal stopped them from attending classes, and were also denied permission to go to the library, after which the students returned home.

2 terrorists killed in encounter at Anantnag in J&K

MI News Service, Srinagar: Two unidentified terrorists have been killed in an ongoing encounter between security forces at Bijbehara in South Kashmir's Anantnag district, officials said on Saturday. "Two terrorists killed, incriminating materials including arms and ammunition recovered. Search going on," police said.

The firefight between terrorists and security forces took place after a joint team of the police and the security forces cordoned off the area and launched a search operation on the basis of specific information about presence of terrorists. When security forces reached on the spot where terrorists were hiding they came under a heavy volume of fire that triggered the encounter.

Father of 10-yr old boy who shouted communal slogans taken into police custody

MI News Service, Kochi: A day after the Kerala High Court took a strong position and directed the government to take firm action against those responsible for a ten-year-old child raising provocative slogans against non-Muslims at a Popular Front of India (PFI) rally in Alappuzha on May 21, the police on Saturday took into custody the boy's father. Confirming this, a top police official said he was picked up from his house here and has been handed over to the Alappuzha police. But the father of the boy said that none had tortured the boy and he did it on his own. "This same slogans have been aired a few times in the past and surprisingly, when no action took place then, how come this time it has turned out to be like this," asked the boy's father before he was taken away by the police. When the police arrived at the house of the boy, a good number of PFI activists were present and they shouted slogans against the police.

On Friday around 18 people, who took part in the rally held at Alappuzha Sloganeering, was arrested. The boy, who lives at the Pampady near here, was identified, a few days back but the police failed to find anyone in the house as it was locked, when they came. Meanwhile the police are looking into if the boy needs to be sent for counselling and are also contemplating on what needs to be done to his mother, as guardians have been held responsible. As the video of the incident went viral, there were numerous protests against it following which the police swung into action and the High Court took up the matter early this week and on Friday the court came down heavily against this act and asked for strong action to be taken. The boy's father was earlier identified as a known PFI activist who had participated in the Citizenship (Amendment) Act protests.

The boy was brought to Alappuzha to take part in the rally by his father and was spotted sitting along the shoulders of a man called Anzar, and leading the sloganeering. Anzar, who hails from Kottayam district, was the first to be taken into custody and he is now in judicial custody at the court. He has been registered against the organizers of the rally for promoting rivalry and hatred among communities. The PFI has also attempted to downplay the incident saying that the slogans were against "Hindutva fascists" and not against Hindus or Christians.

Stringent action against those who torment Kannadigas, says CM Bommai

MI News Service, Bengaluru: Karnataka Government is taking stringent action against those who torment Kannadigas, says Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai on Saturday, warned of stringent action against those who torment Kannadigas (kannada speaking people) in the southern state.

"The state government will not tolerate any sort of vandalism. Those who try to take the law into their hands will be dealt with seriousness. The police are taking appropriate action," Bommai said while speaking to reporters. Several people were left injured after activists of Maharashtra Ekkikaran Samiti (MES) allegedly attacked members of a procession on Thursday.

Reportedly, the violent spot started in a marriage procession for playing songs in the regional language.

We will tell Indian history of victories not defeats: K'taka Min

MI News Service, Bengaluru: At a time when the agitation is growing stronger to drop revised syllabus for Karnataka textbooks of Class 1 to 10 standards, and Social Science books of Class 6 to 10, the ruling BJP in Karnataka is asserting its firm resolve to implement the new syllabus. Karnataka Education Minister B.C. Nagesh on Saturday said, "We will tell history of Indian victories not defeats to our children. Everyone wrote about defeats throughout the history, none wrote about victories."

He further said, "We are all set to tell historical victories of India." After the inauguration of "Amruta Bharatige Kannadada Aerates" program organized by Kannada and Culture Department he said, India had its own system before the invasion of foreigners. "The volume of injustice done by British and Muslim rulers had not been done by anyone," he said.

"Muslims have destroyed temples, culture of the land and snatched away our self respect," he said. "Our people did not take sword to conquer any foreign land and conquer had only the intention to destroy Gurukulaks," he said. Nagesh said the British did not conquer this land with their intelligence and valour. "But, they came to power by divide and rule policy, through illegal and immoral ways."

"But, our freedom fighters turned revolutionaries have challenged the British empire and took away their peace of mind," he said, adding, "Children must be taught that the freedom was achieved through the sacrifice and martyrdom of crore of people."

People-smuggling thrives on bribes to Taliban

MI News Service, Nimroz: The Taliban has tried to stem the flow of Afghans attempting to escape economic ruin and persecution. But, despite an official ban, the smuggling of undocumented migrants to neighbouring Iran and Pakistan continues to rise with the help of Taliban border guards and officials willing to look the other way. RFE/RL reported. As Afghanistan's economy collapses, its citizens continue to leave the country en masse in a trend that began to rise with the announced withdrawal of foreign forces in the spring of 2021 and which spiked after the Taliban seized power in August.

Iran, a major destination country, has clamped down by beefing up security along its 900 km border with Afghanistan and deporting tens of thousands of Afghans, RFE/RL reported. Taliban authorities in the southwestern province of Nimroz, which abuts Afghanistan's borders with Iran and Pakistan and serves as a major migration hub, have banned human smuggling in an effort to stem the outflow. But smugglers say that the hurdles are nothing that cannot be overcome by bribing Taliban guards and officials willing to look the other way to keep business booming. RFE/RL reported. The Taliban, which used Afghans not to leave the country, has tried to cut off migration routes and authorities in Nimroz have issued bans against the smuggling of people to Iran.

Mawlawi Sarfar Mohammad Avubi, the Taliban's police chief in Nimroz, recently announced a local ban on illegal immigration in an audiotape released by the province's Information and Culture Department. From April 9 to May 6, nearly 230,000 Afghans fled out of the country, most bound for neighboring Iran and Pakistan, according to the latest statistics from the UN's International Organization for Migration (IOM).

In the past year, more than 1.6 million Afghans crossed into Iran, according to the IOM, the vast majority of them undocumented migrants who seek work there or who intend to use Iran as a jumping-off point to migrate to Turkey and Europe.

Iran, which is mired in its own economic crisis amid skyrocketing inflation and rising food prices, has expressed alarm at the number of undocumented Afghans on its soil, putting the number at some 5 million people, RFE/RL reported.

'Aryan Khan started smoking Ganja as student in the US'

MI News Service, Mumbai: Aryan Khan, 23, the son of Bollywood megastar Shah Rukh Khan and producer Gauri Khan, admitted to the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) that he started smoking Ganja (cannabis) in 2018 while studying for graduation in the US.

The "voluntary statement" of Aryan, made under NDPS Act, 1985, Set 67, before Ashish Ranjan, IO, is part of the final complaint lodged before the Special NDPS Court by the NCB on Friday (May 27), and came to light hours after the superstar-son was exonerated from the case.

He claimed that at that time, he was suffering from certain sleep disorders and he had read articles on the Internet informing Ganja (also known as bhang, pot, grass, etc) could help.

Unaware of what lay in store for him ahead, Aryan revealed that he was friends with another co-accused, Arbaaz Merchant since the past several years and even the latter smoked

and with whom he was to share a cabin in the Cordelia Cruise ship.

When the IO asked Aryan whether he deals with narcotic drugs, he replied that he was into consumption of only natural drugs like Ganja or Hashish.

Aryan also revealed that Arbaaz had taken out and handed over a small quantity of Charas to the NCB IO Ashish Ranjan Prasad, and said whatever was recovered (from Arbaaz) was for consumption only and probably procured by him from Banda, after which the NCB team sealed the Charas with some kit and tested it in a pouch.

Later, the NCB has thoroughly searched all the cabins allotted to Aryan and his friends, and served with a notice to appear immediately before the NCB Mumbai Office to give his voluntary statement.

In the questioning, Aryan confessed to making the "incriminating WhatsApp drug chats" on his mobile phone and signed on the chats transcript.
