Govt allows banks to use biometrics to stop fraud

The Indian government is allowing banks to verify individual transactions that exceed a certain annual limit using facial recognition and an iris scan in some cases, in a bid to reduce fraud and tax evasion, three sources told Reuters.

A few large private and public banks have begun using the option, said one of the sources, a banker, who declined to name the banks. The advisory allowing the verification is not public and has not previously been reported.

The verification is not mandatory and is intended for cases where another government identification card used for tax purposes, the Permanent Account Number (PAN) card, is not shared with banks.

The prospect of banks using facial recognition has concerned some privacy experts. "This raises substantial privacy concerns especially when India lacks a dedicated law on privacy, cyber security and facial recognition," said Pavan Duggal, an advocate and cyber law expert.

The government has said it is targeting a parliamentary approval of a new privacy law by early 2023.

The new measures can be used to verify identities of individuals making deposits and withdrawals exceeding 2 million rupees (\$24,478) in a financial year, where the Aadhaar identity card is shared as proof of identity, said two government officials, who asked not to be named because the information is not public.

India struggles to be the next China despite iPhone boost

Geopolitics will drive some investments to India, but country needs to ease regulations more

On paper, India's chances of attracting global manufacturers look rosy.

Apple Inc. began assembling its latest iPhone models in the South Asian nation in a significant break from its practice of reserving much of that for giant Chinese factories run by its main Taiwanese assembler, a key win for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 'Make in India' campaign.

Among India's advantages are rising geopolitical tensions between Western nations and China, and a growing friendship with the U.S., Australia and Japan, which form part of the Quad, a grouping of democracies to counter Beijing's economic and military ambitions.

The country's presidency of Group of 20 nations this year could also boost investor confidence. India is poised to hold the title of the world's fastest-growing large economy in the next three years. Its gross domestic product is set to become the world's third largest before the end of the decade.

But experts warn that lasting gains to improve a sluggish manufacturing sector are still a ways off for India, soon to overtake China as the most populous nation. Modi's Make in India campaign, which aims to increase exports and create jobs, hasn't quite panned out. Manufacturing accounts for 14% of the economy, a figure that's barely budged in the last decade.

Modi's government will need to prove that India is a cheaper and easier place to conduct business, rather than simply relying on political or security factors to lure companies. While recent financial incentives under Modi offered Apple a cost-efficient path to set up shop in India, the California-based company is still making fraction of its iPhones in the nation. And for every success, there are many companies that have quit India because of long-running challenges such as dealing with the country's bureaucracy, including

Falling inflation, global cues boost equity markets

Softer inflation in the US and in India boosted the stock markets. While retail inflation fell to a one-year low of 5.72% in December in India, industrial production was better than expected. That apart, with US inflation numbers falling in line with analyst expectations, the dollar index and 10-year bond yields have also softened.

On Friday, the Nifty and Sensex gained 0.55% and 0.51%, respectively.

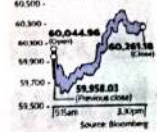
A New York-based research, Govint Financial Services, said easing inflation and encouraging Q3 numbers projected by the second set of IT majors are outweighing the concerns of the markets. Consumer price index (CPI) inflation in India and US cooled off, bolstering expectations of a less aggressive policy stance by the central banks.

Nifty closed at the highest levels in four sessions as IT stocks rose following encouraging results and the guidance from industry leaders. The positive start to the results season should also accrue benefits for the benchmark, said analysts.
